Wivenhoe House by Jo Hunter

We are delighted to welcome you to afternoon tea at Wivenhoe House. This quintessential English institution was made fashionable by Anna, the 7th Duchess of Bedford in the early 19th century who is said to have complained of “having that sinking feeling” during late afternoon.

The solution for the Duchess was a pot of tea and a light snack, taken privately in her boudoir during the afternoon.

Later, friends were invited to join her in her rooms at Woburn Abbey and this summer practice proved so popular that the Duchess continued it when she returned to London, sending cards to her friends asking them to join her for “tea and walking the fields”.

Since Wivenhoe House was built in the mid-18th century, it has played its own important role in history. In 1816 the Grade II listed main house was immortalised in canvas by the renowned landscape artist John Constable. The beautiful painting now hangs in pride of place in the British collection in the National Gallery of Art, Washington.

To celebrate the 200th anniversary of Constable’s painting, in 2016 we commissioned an original work by artist Kate Bright. This can be viewed in the Garden Wing from outside the brasserie.
